TITLE VI POLICY STATEMENT

The Kennedy Center Inc. is committed to ensuring that no person is excluded from participating, denied benefits, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity, on the basis of race, color, or national origin.

The Kennedy Center as a recipient of federal financial assistance will ensure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended and related statutes and regulations in all of the Kennedy Center Inc. programs and activities.

Any person who believes that he or she has been subjected to discrimination or retaliation based on their race, color or national origin may file a Title VI complaint. Complaints may be filed directly to The Kennedy Center Inc. or to the Federal Funding Agency. Complaints must be in writing and signed by the complainant or a representative and should include the complainant's name, address, and telephone number or other means by which the complainant can be contacted.
